Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 9203, I am providing a ballot title and summary of a proposed measure filed with you on February 14, 2022. The Elections Code requires that you transmit this ballot title and summary to the Proponent of the proposed measure.

Initiative Measure to be Submitted Directly to the Voters

The City Attorney has prepared the following ballot title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

AN INITIATIVE TO ADOPT A HEALTHCARE WORKERS MINIMUM WAGE ORDINANCE IN THE CITY OF CULVER CITY, ESTABLISHING A MINIMUM WAGE OF TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS PER HOUR FOR COVERED EMPLOYEES WORKING AT HEALTHCARE FACILITIES

The proposed initiative measure, if approved by the voters, would adopt an ordinance adding Chapter 11.33 to the Culver City Municipal Code, establishing a \$25.00 per hour minimum wage for covered employees working at a covered healthcare facility. Covered employees include a clinician, nurse, aid, technician, maintenance worker, janitorial or housekeeping staff, groundskeeper, guard, food service worker, pharmacist, and administrative or clerical worker, but do not include a manager or supervisor. Covered healthcare facilities include licensed general acute care hospitals, licensed acute psychiatric hospitals, outpatient clinics that are part of a general acute care hospital or acute psychiatric hospital, licensed chronic dialysis clinics, licensed psychiatric health facilities, and all facilities that are part of an Integrated Healthcare Delivery System as defined in the initiative.

The minimum wage rate would be adjusted annually for increases in the cost of living. If adopted, the ordinance would prohibit an employer from funding the minimum wage increase through layoffs or reductions in benefits or hours. The ordinance would allow a one-year, court-granted waiver to an employer demonstrating sufficient financial hardship.

Under the proposed ordinance, the City would be responsible for enforcement of the ordinance, including receiving or investigating complaints, establishing and administering an administrative citation process that includes imposition of correction orders, administrative fines and penalties owed to the City, and a hearing and appeal process; taking action to collect back wages due to the healthcare workers; and conducting educational activities to ensure compliance with the ordinance. As an

enforcement alternative, the ordinance allows the City to enter into an agreement with the County of Los Angeles to provide wage enforcement and educational responsibilities. The proposed ordinance also establishes the right of a healthcare worker to bring an action in civil court against an employer who violates the ordinance or who retaliates against an employee who brings a complaint under the ordinance.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO CIRCULATE PETITION

Notice is hereby given by the persons whose names appear hereon of their intention to circulate the petition within the City of Culver City for the purpose of adopting an initiative that will enact provisions regarding the minimum wage for covered healthcare workers in the City.

A statement of the reasons of the proposed action as contemplated in said petition is as follows (up to 500 words):

The purpose of the Healthcare Workers Minimum Wage Ordinance is to establish a minimum wage for covered healthcare workers within the City of Culver City. The City needs a sufficient healthcare workforce to ensure that healthcare facilities within the City offer consistent, timely, high-quality care to patients. Healthcare job vacancies are rising as workers on the front lines deal with the emotional, mental, and physical toll of providing healthcare during a pandemic, and many hospitals, health systems and clinics are understaffed. With rising housing costs, healthcare workers are being forced to live further from their places of work, increasing their stress and adding to retention challenges. Raising the minimum wage for covered healthcare workers will help address retention challenges and workforce shortages affecting healthcare facilities in Culver City and will fairly compensate healthcare workers for their contributions and sacrifices.
